What is Too Into You?

Women's Aid runs the Too Into You project to teach young people, in particular young women, aged 18-25 about intimate relationship abuse.

Intimate relationship abuse is abuse by a partner or ex. This can include emotional, physical, sexual, online, economic abuse and coercive control.

Abuse is common. 1 in 5 young women aged 18-25 have been subjected to abuse by a current male partner or ex in Ireland.

What we do:

- Teach young people about the difference between healthy and unhealthy relationships
- Provide an instant messaging support service for anyone worried about their own relationship or a friends relationship
- Run awareness campaigns on the red flags of abuse
- · Carry out research on intimate relationship abuse in Ireland

► Adult literacy research



Did you know

- almost 1 in 2 adults with poor health have literacy needs (49%)?
- over half of adults with poor health have numeracy needs (57%)?

We have learned this and much more about adult literacy in Ireland, from the findings of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) Survey of Adult Skills 2023.
