► What Works/Foundations Prevention and Early Intervention Webinars 2025

11 July 2025: The value and purpose of different research designs for understanding what works

In this webinar we'll be explaining why different kinds of research are needed to understand how interventions work, and why robust trials are needed to understand what works. We'll explore the advantages and limitations of different kinds of research evidence; the difference between evidence strength, evidence standards and evidence hierarchies; and why experimental evidence is typically prioritised for identifying 'what works'.

19 September 2025: 10 Steps for Evaluation Success: Turning science-based theories into effective interventions

In this webinar, we'll discuss how evaluation can help improve the quality of interventions at each stage of their development, and explain how the 10 steps map onto the Evidence Hub evidence standards. These steps include developing a theory of change, early stage and pilot evaluation, trials to find out what works, and scaling up.

What are effective ways to support parents, particularly those facing adversities? In this webinar we'll discuss the kinds of complex adversities families may face, which may impact on children's development and health; what we know about effective parenting interventions, before and after a child's birth; and the kinds of positive outcomes which interventions can have on children's development, parenting practice, and parental stress. We'll also consider the need for equitable access to effective parenting interventions for families from minoritised ethnic backgrounds.


► The Barnardos Parental Advocacy and Information Service Webinars

- Kinship care and non-relative kinship care





► 'Fragments from the sea' The Wexford Whale and circular mosaics on Wexford Bridge wall, with Helen McLean



This visual presentation will explore the creation of the Chanie mosaics and the incredible stories behind the shipwreck pottery. Fragments from shipwrecks from 150 years ago were collected on local beaches by Rosslare native Ann Borg who collected pieces from age 7 years -70 years. The Chanie's draw together fascinating historical threads in Wexford's history including the Wexford whale, the shipwrecks off Tuskar, the pottery factory in Stratford and the ships destination which was North Carolina.

Helen McLean originally from Holywood, County Down established her studio in Wexford Town over 22 years ago. Working as an artist for over 35 years Helen has created large scale paintings, mosaic and glass public artworks throughout the UK, America and Ireland. Over the last ten years Helen has installed 12 mosaic artworks throughout Wexford town and in surrounding towns and villages throughout Ireland.

► This wasn't a strike. It was a Lockout! - Wexford Lockout 1911/1912 with Local Historian Helen Corish



This was a turbulent and most significant time in Irish history. One hundred and thirteen years ago, approximately 700 foundry workers in Wexford Town were "locked out" by their employers, for seeking the right to join the union of their choice, The Irish Transport and General Workers Union. For almost six months they suffered undue hardship and deprivation in their struggle for social justice. The courage and determination of the workers, their families, supporters and leaders during the Lockout, culminated in a victory for the foundry workers.

► Book Launch & Talk - Wexford Recipients of Mons Star WW1 with Comdt Larry Scallan & Mary Anne Maher



A new book, Mons Star to the Royal Irish Regiment by Mary Anne Maher and Larry Scallan, which researches soldiers mostly from Kilkenny, Tipperary, Wexford and Waterford, will launch at Wexford Library on Thursday 24th July at 7pm.

This one of a kind book details the order of deployment, rank and alphabetical order of the regiment's 1,928 men who were awarded the 'Mons' Star medal given to men who served in France or Belgium between the day after Britain's declaration of war against the Central Powers on August 5th, 1914 and the end of Second Battle of Ypres on November 22nd, 1914.

Authors Maher and Scallan have a long-standing shared interest in the Royal Irish Regiment due to the fact that both had a great-granduncle killed in an engagement between the regiment and the German army in Le Pilly, France in October 1914.

The book is the culmination of four years of this research and includes details such as a post-war address for 72% of the soldiers and the names and locations of when and where over 800 men were taken prisoner of war.

► Wexford Science Cafe: Al and the workforce of the future with Daragh O Brien




Daragh O Brien, managing director of Castlebridge consultancy, will discuss the critical skills and risks arising as organisations mistake fear of missing out on AI for strategy.
